Volleyball World

Volleyball World was created in 2021 to provide fans, athletes, partners, and other sport afficionados with the ultimate volleyball and beach volleyball experience.

The organisation aims to grow the sport's two principal disciplines and attract new fans to the intense action and unique courtside entertainment which can be expected at its events.

Together with their main partner, the FIVB, Volleyball World organizes volleyball and beach volleyball events all year round and provides fans with worldwide coverage of the sport online.

Volleyball Nations League

The Volleyball Nations League was launched in 2018, building on the innovative sports presentation on display at the Rio 2016 Olympic Games.

In both the men's and women's leagues, 16 teams battle to become Volleyball Nations League champion. A total of 104 matches per gender will be played across the Preliminary and Final phases, with every team playing a minimum of 12 matches.

By pushing the boundaries of technology, innovation and digital broadcasting, spectators at home witness new and diverse angles, showcasing the world-class athleticism of each nation's best players, while the in-stadium experience is no less impressive, boosted by the implementation of a new concept called active engagement, where fans are involved in every rally.

Format

The Volleyball Nations League (VNL) will be played based on the same competition formula as in 2022, featuring 16 teams per gender.

A total of 104 matches per gender will be played across the Preliminary and Final phases, with every team playing a minimum of 12 matches.

Following the end of the previous edition of the VNL, the 16 participating teams were ranked from 1st to 16th as per the FIVB Volleyball World Ranking.

In 2023, each team will play 12 matches over the three-week Preliminary Phase, against equally strong opponents – against 3 teams ranked from 1st to 4th, 3 teams ranked from 5th to 8th, 3 teams ranked 9th to 12th and 3 teams ranked from 13th to 16th.

Preliminary Phase

- 16 participating teams for both genders
- Preliminary Phase played over 3 weeks
- 12 matches per team
- 96 matches in total per gender in the VNL Preliminary Phase

Qualification for the Final Phase

- The top eight teams as per the Team Ranking System at the end of the Preliminary Phase advance to the Final Phase (quarterfinals).
- The national team of the hosting territory of the event will have a guaranteed berth for the Final Phase.

Final Phase

Final Phase will be played in a Final 8 direct elimination formula:

- Quarterfinal 1: 1st Ranked Team vs 8th Ranked Team
- Quarterfinal 2: 2nd Ranked Team vs 7th Ranked Team
- Quarterfinal 3: 3rd Ranked Team vs 6th Ranked Team
- Quarterfinal 4: 4th Ranked Team vs 5th Ranked Team

* The order of the quarterfinals can be changed based on a request from the Media Rights Holders.

The teams that do not win the quarterfinals will be ranked 5th to 8th in the Final Standings of the VNL 2023 as per the Teams Ranking System (including the results of the Preliminary Phase).

The winner of the quarterfinal 1 will play a semifinal match against the winner of the quarterfinal 4 and the winner of the quarterfinal 2 will play a semifinal match against the winner of the quarterfinal 3.

VNL Promotion-Relegation Process

The lowest ranked Challenger team of the current edition of the VNL will play the Volleyball Challenger Cup (VCC) held after the VNL. The winner of the current edition of the VCC shall be promoted and compete in the next edition of the VNL.
