ANTI-DOPING

Doping controls are carried out at competition venues, training sites, athletes' places of residence or any other location.

After doping controls have been carried out at Paris 2024 venues, athletes and officials may use the usual transport services (TA) to return to the Villages.

Outside TA service operating hours, Paris 2024 will ensure that a transport solution is available for their return.

As doping controls may take place at any time during the period of the Olympic Games, all athletes competing must provide complete whereabouts information.

The quantity and timing of tests, their nature and the identity of athletes selected for doping control are defined in accordance with the test distribution plans developed by the ITA.

TRANSPORTATION AFTER COMPLETING DOPING CONTROL ON THE DAY OF THE CLOSING CEREMONY

Doping control will also be conducted on the day of the Closing Ceremony. All athletes undergoing doping control must complete testing at their competition venue before travelling to the Closing Ceremony. After completing doping control, Paris 2024 will transport athletes to the Olympic Village. Athletes participating in the Closing Ceremony are requested to take a bus to the Olympic Stadium from the Olympic Village. Therefore, Paris 2024 recommends that all athletes who are competing on the day of the Closing Ceremony take with them to their competition venue all necessary items that may be required during the Closing Ceremony (such as their uniforms) as they may not be able to return to their accommodation in the Olympic Village prior to going to the ceremony.

MEDICAL

- a) All athletes are obliged to present a health certificate (M-3 Form) at the Preliminary Inquiry, for athletes listed in the O-2bis Form. This health certificate must be signed by the athlete's Doctor and the competitor who thus both take the responsibility for the validity of such certificate. The Form is valid for one year.
- b) First aid and medical treatment will be provided by the organising committee under the control of the dedicated FIVB Technical Officials and FIVB Medical Officer.
- c) First aid facilities, medical doctor and nurse will be provided in each competition hall for the athletes and spectators.
- d) First aid will be provided in the training hall (nurse, medical supplies).
- e) First aid for athletes will be provided in the Olympic Village or with doctors on call.
- f) Ambulance will be provided in the venue, close to athlete entrance and workforce PSA, if it is unavailable (due to, for example, it is already in transport to a local hospital), the time for another ambulance to arrive should be less than 10 minutes.
- g) Determination of hospital for possible hospitalization is mandatory.

SAFE SPORT ZONE

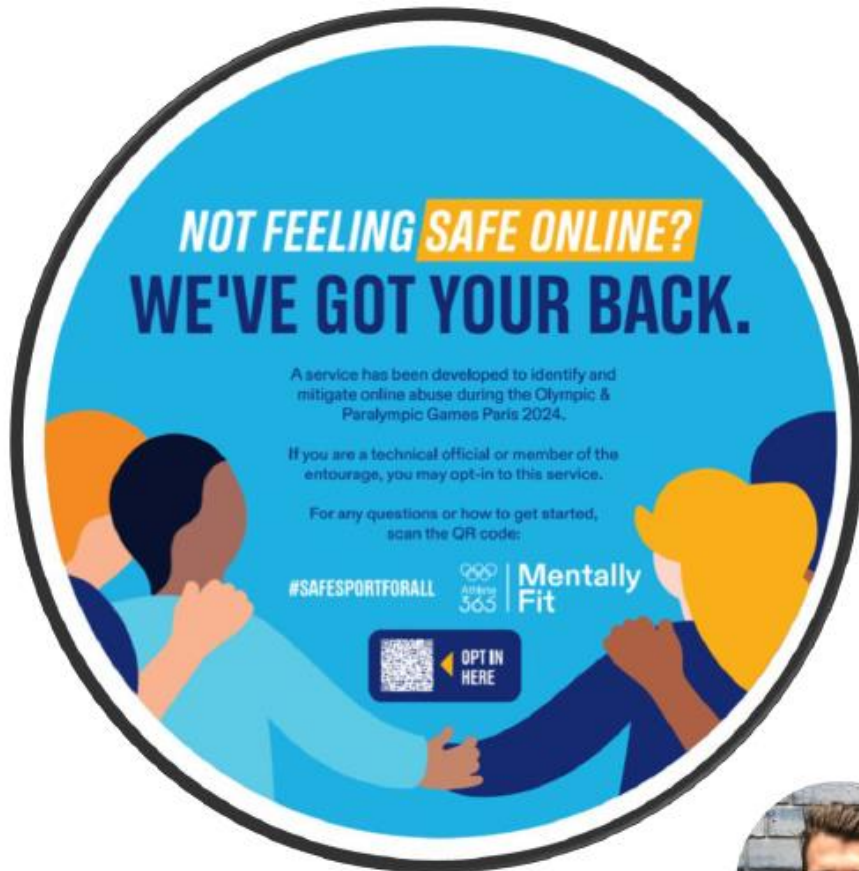


All athletes have the right to participate in a safe and supportive environment, and at Paris 2024 you will have access to resources that can provide you with help and support if/when you need it.

- Located in the Paris Olympic Village **above the Fitness Centre**
- IOC Safeguarding Officers available for private consultation and/or for reporting safeguarding concerns
- All conversations will be strictly confidential
- Welfare Officers from National Olympic Committees and International Federations will be on the ground to support **if/when needed**

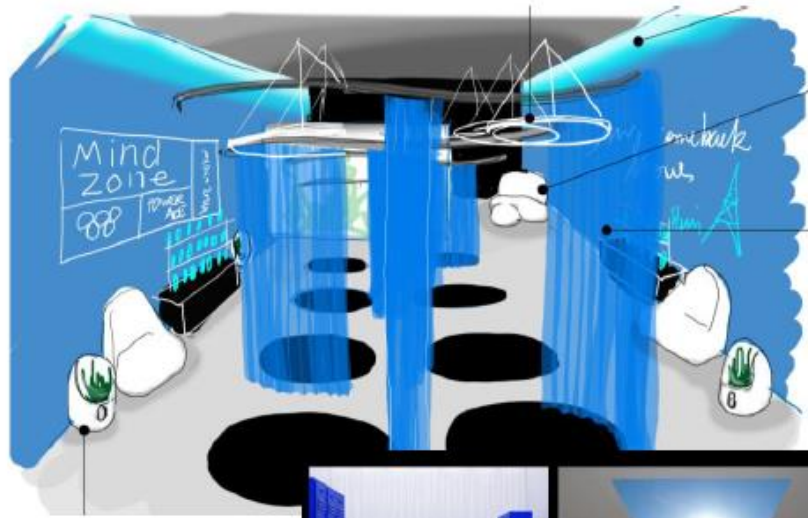


CYBER-ABUSE PROTECTION SERVICE



- AI powered cyber-abuse protection service designed specifically for sport
- Available to 15,000 athletes and more than 2,000 officials/entourage members across the Olympic and Paralympic Games
- Monitors all major social media platforms in more than 35 languages in real time – *estimating around half a billion social media posts*
- Service begins 48 hours prior to the Opening Ceremony and concludes 48 hours after the Closing Ceremony

ATHLETE365 MIND ZONE



- Located in the Paris 2024 Olympic Village above the Fitness Centre
- A **quiet** place to disconnect, recharge, refocus and mentally prepare for competition
- Trained IOC Safe Sport staff available to provide **mental health first aid**
- Mindfulness activities in collaboration with Powerade to improve well-being
- Open to all athletes and entourage members throughout Games-time

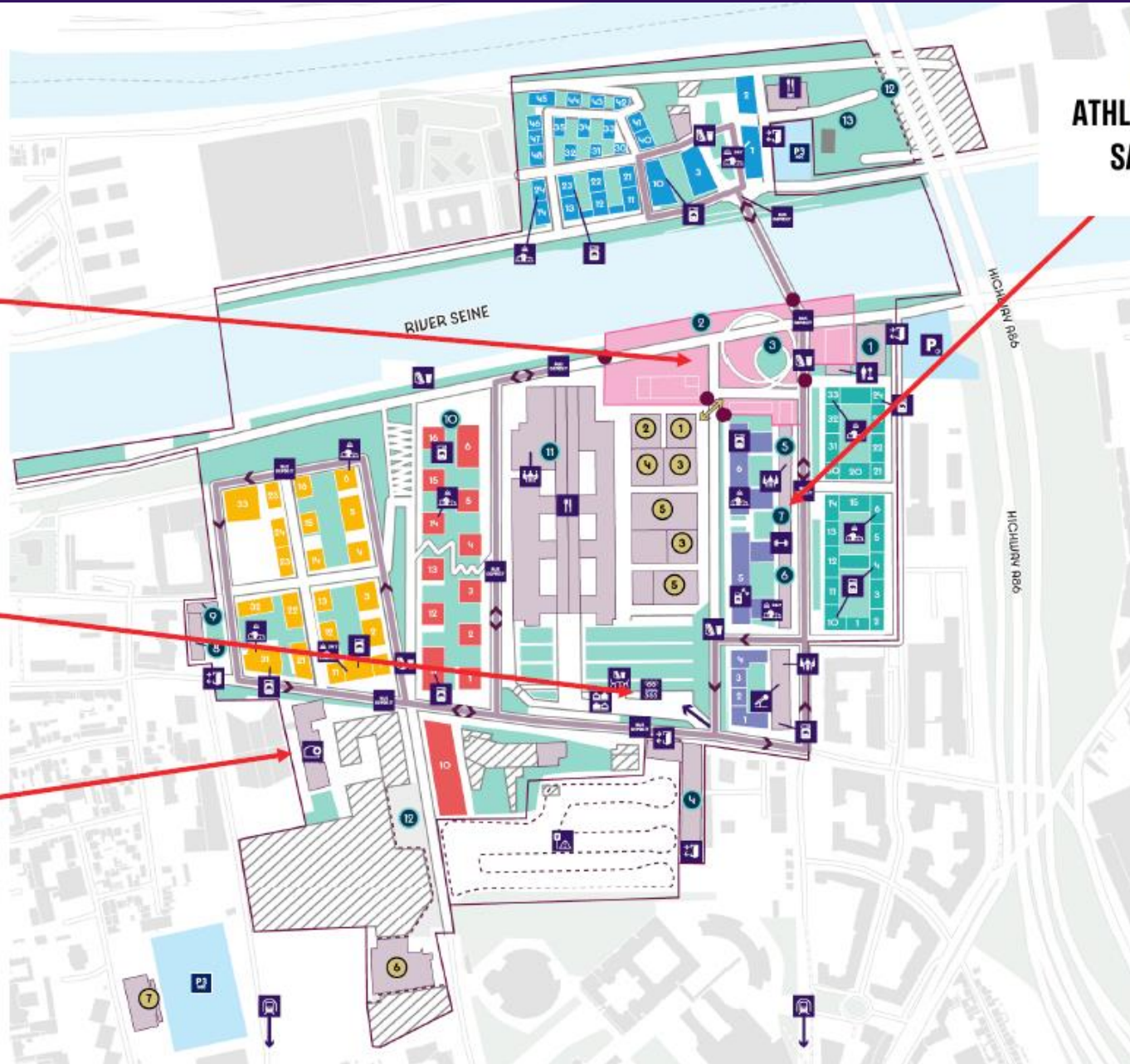

EXPECTED STANDARDS OF BEHAVIOUR

ALL PARTICIPANTS ARE REQUIRED TO:

ALWAYS...

- **uphold** the laws of the Host Nation and all applicable sport codes and rules and regulations, and refrain from encouraging others to break any laws, rules or regulations;
- **ensure** that intentions, actions and communications reflect a commitment to prioritising the safety and well-being of all Participants;
- **maintain** the highest standards of conduct, respect positions of authority and/or trust, and act in the best interest of children, young people and/or vulnerable persons;
- **be aware** of your own behaviour, maintain appropriate boundaries with others, and respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person without any form of discrimination;
- **stand against and report** any form of harassment and abuse, neglect, abuse of power, trust, influence or authority, bullying or any other behaviour that would reasonably be considered abusive amongst or towards any individuals.

NEVER...

- **condone** or engage in any form of psychological, physical or sexual violence or neglect towards others;
- **engage** in physical or online activities that could reasonably be considered inappropriate or culturally insensitive towards others, especially children and other vulnerable persons;
- **make** or share comments or images that could be reasonably considered inappropriate, demeaning or indecent, or place people at risk of physical, emotional or reputational damage.

AVENUES AVAILABLE TO ALL PARTICIPANTS TO REACH OUT FOR CONSULTATION OR TO REPORT A CONCERN



- IOC Safeguarding Officers will be available for personal private conversations in the Safe Sport Zone located above the Fitness Centre in the OLV.

WE MAY BECOME AWARE OF CONCERNS VIA

- a personal disclosure from the affected person(s)
- witnessing an inappropriate interaction that breaches relevant codes of conduct (IOC, NOC, IF, OGOC)
- receiving or hearing allegations from a third party

DISCIPLINARY ISSUES

- ✓ **Legal Basis- FIVB Disciplinary Regulations**
- ✓ **DP Sub-Committee will decide the case and any sanctions imposed (which are limited to Olympic Games).**
- ✓ **Process will be conducted in an expedited matter as quickly as possible (hours or days, not weeks) while also respecting the accused's right to be heard.**
- ✓ **NO BETTING ALLOWED ON ANY EVENTS OF THE OLYMPIC GAMES.**
